Rev. Mr. J. S. Cox Will Deliver Baccalaureate Sermon June 6

Rector of Saint Paul's Church, Winston-Salem, Will Preach

Rev. Mr. James S. Cox, rector of Saint Paul's Church of Winston-Salem, will deliver the 106th annual baccalaureate sermon in the Saint Mary's Chapel on Sunday morning, June 6, at 11:00 a.m.

Born at Camilla, Georgia, Mr. Cox attended school in Orlando, Florida, Rollins College, and George Washington University. He received his A.B. and M.A. degrees from Duke University and his B.D. degree from the Virginia Theological Seminary in 1934.

RECTORIAL POSITIONS

He has been rector of Ascension Church, Silver Springs, Maryland, Emmanuel Church, Chatham, Virginia, and Holy Comforter Church, Burlington.

In this diocese Mr. Cox has been on the Executive Council, chairman of the Department of Promotion, chairman of Reconstruction and Advanced Fund for this diocese, and a deputy to the General Convention.

Being a father of three children, Mr. Cox is well-known in Winston-Salem as a leader of young people.

CHAPEL PROCESSION

The procession to the chapel for the service on Sunday morning will be the same as usual. The faculty and graduating classes will wear caps and gowns and each will sit in a body.

Dr. E. M. Gwathmey Will Address Saint Mary's Graduating Class

Converse College President Will Speak To Large Crowd

Dr. Edward M. Gwathmey, Ph.D., LL.D., of Converse College, Spartanburg, will deliver the baccalaureate address in the auditorium, Monday, June 7.

A Virginian by birth, Dr. Gwathmey attended undergraduate school at the University of Richmond and received his Ph.D. from the University of Virginia and LL.D. from the University of South Carolina.

PROFESSOR AT WILLIAM AND MARY

He was professor of English at William and Mary College, Williamsburg, Virginia, until he was appointed the school's Norfolk director. In 1933, while he was holding this same position, Dr. Gwathmey was made president of Converse. His first appointee to Converse was Dr. Stone.

Dr. Gwathmey is noted in Spartanburg not only for his outstanding work at Converse but also for his work as a vestryman in the Church of the Advent and his part in community life.

GRADUATION PROCESSION

The procession to the auditorium for the baccalaureate address, and the awarding of High School diplomas, prizes, and certificates will organize in Smedes Hall at 10:00 a.m. Freshmen and Juniors will lead the procession followed by the two graduating classes, faculty, clergy, and trustees.

After the auditorium exercises, the procession will go to the Chapel where diplomas will be awarded to the Senior class by Bishop Penick and Dr. Stone. Bishop Penick will deliver a brief farewell address.

After the conclusion of the exercises in the Chapel, students, faculty, officers, clergy, and trustees will march to the front campus.
