

NC Student Journalists Convene For Press Conference In Carolina Hotel

State College Plays Host to Collegiate Press Association

N. C. State College played host to the North Carolina Collegiate Press Association which held its annual three day meeting in Raleigh beginning Thursday, April 21.

The gathering, attended by publications representatives of colleges and universities throughout the state, featured panel discussions and clinics designed to aid in solving the problems of student journalism, and to introduce and compare new trends in the field of the collegiate press.

Included on the program were discussions led by such prominent journalists as Noel Yancey, head of the Associated Press News Bureau in Raleigh; Dr. Lodwick Hartley, head of the Department of English at North Carolina State College; Don Barry, editor of the *Durham Sun*; and George Anderson, news editor of the *Greensboro Daily News*.

On Friday, April 22, the student delegates were entertained at a luncheon at the North Carolina State College Cafeteria as guests of the State College Board of Student Publications. The Collegiate Press Association banquet was held Friday night for the delegates in the ballroom of the Carolina Hotel.

NEW OFFICERS ELECTED

At the final meeting held on Saturday morning, the conference elected officers for the coming year. Officers chosen were Ellen Metz of Woman's College, president; Joe Hancock of N. C. State College, vice-president; Garland Rakestraw of Guilford College, secretary; and Leo Derrick of Wake Forest, treasurer.

Winners in the competitive journalism contest were announced at the Saturday morning meeting. Receiving first awards were the Woman's College *Caroliner* as the All-State A Newspaper; the *Elon Morning and Gold* as the All-State B Newspaper; and the *Mars Hill Hilltop* as the All-State C Newspaper. A dual first prize was given to Duke and Woman's College for the best literary magazines and Woman's College was awarded the first prize for the best yearbook.

In her talk, Marjorie Story mentioned some of the things to look for in a picture, as repetition and alternation of value and texture or paint quality. She also said that subject matter was least important, for a subject could be handled in many different ways.

Frances Drane explained the elements of design present in the seven art problems featured. Five were done by Marjorie Sheridan, one by Berta Allen Russ, and one by Catherine Creighton. Each problem illustrated one of the elements of design: line, color, volume and space, or texture.
