### Donald Peery Gives Piano Recital Here SM Teacher Plays Selections

By Bach, Brahms, and Moderns Donald Peery, instructor of piano, presented his 1948-49 series piano recital on May 16, in the school auditorium. Mr. Peery studied music <sup>at</sup> Oberlin, and he later received his Master's Degree at Columbia University.

The concert opened with Bach's Prelude and Fugue in B minor from the Well-Tempered Clavier,  $B_{00k}$  2). The second selection was Sonata in E flat major by Haydn; the three movements of the sonata, Allegro, Adagio, and Presto were <sup>lgorous</sup>, crisp, and interestingly executed.

The second group consisted of Rep works by Brahms: "Edward" Ballade, Intermezzo, Opus 76, No. 6, and Capricco, Opus 116, No. 7. Two selections of Chopin, Nocturne  $m_{F}$  sharp minor and Scherzo in B minor, followed the Brahms. Mr. Peery chose the Chopin Nocturne in memory of the late Mary Lois Farrell, a former music teacher of his. The Chopin Scherzo in B minor furnished a dramatic ending for the group.

After a brief intermission, Mr. peery concluded his concert with an alteresting and varied group of modin songs. The first of these were bree preludes by Debussy; the secprelude, Bruyeres, was especialbeautiful. ### State Department Issues Warning On Possible Russian Attack Of Europe

The State Department issued a dealing with the Atlantic Pact, Eunew warning on May 14 of a possi-ble Russian attack on Western Eu-rope despite a relaxation of "cold" also cutlined a six-point military aid rope despite a relaxation of "cold war" tension after the lifting of the Berlin blockade.
