Kirsten Flagstad Sings For Raleigh Audience

Rirsten Flagstad, Norwegian so-prano, appeared in concert at Ra-leigh At leigh Memorial Auditorium Monday evening, November 28. The great Wagnarian soprano presented the second program in the current series presented by the Civic Music Asso-

This concert attracted a capacity audience which applauded enthusiastically a program of familiar Wagher arias and German songs, as well as some less well known Grieg sung in the original Norwegian, and a group of English songs.
