Civic Music Association announces that Victoria de los Angeles will open the season on November 3, 1952, at Raleigh Memorial Auditorium. A soprano of the Metro-politan Opera, she is now on her second coast to coast tour of the United States.

Senorita de los Angeles won first place in the international contest in Geneva, Switzerland, in 1947. Her United States debut came two years later in Carnegie Hall, New York City. She was so well received that ten days after the close of her first appearance at Carnegie Hall she was asked to return. She has had three sell-out concerts at Carnegie Hall.
