Rabbi Stern Visits Campus

Rabbi Malcolm Stern from Norfolk, Virginia, visited St. Mary's on April 23 and 24.

Dr. Stern spoke to the entire student body twice. In chapel on April 23 he told the origin of Jewish music and played several Jewish hymns on the organ. Thursday in assembly he spoke about the Jews living in America.

In Dr. Guerry's Bible classes he discussed the Jewish calendar, Jewish holidays, and the Jewish beliefs about Christ. Nissan, the first month of the Jewish year, begins in either March or April. Iyar, Sivan, Tammuz, Ab, Elul, Tishri, Heshvan, Kislev, Tebet, Shebat, and Esther are the other months. The religious New Year is the first day of the seventh month. On this day the Jews feast from sun down to sun down to make atonement for their sins.

Some other Jewish holidays are Barmensphah, Shavues, Purin, Hanuka, and the Feast of the Passover. Barmensphah, is the time when the Priest blesses a boy who has completed his Hebrew study. On Shavuos, the boys and girls are confirmed. Purin, the Feast of Lights, in in honor of the first war fought for religious liberty. The Feast of the Passover is a joyous feast for ancestors who were delivered from bondage.

At all of the festivals the Jews eat foods that signify many things. Apples, nuts, cinnamon and wine are a symbol of the mortar their ancestors used. Horse radish symbolizes the bitterness of slavery; parsley and water cress, new vegetation; unleavened bread, winter wheat; and lamb bone on the altar, the Exodus blood.

The Letter Club is the honorary Athletic Club. Its aims are to create interest in school sports, to foster good sportsmanship, and to take charge of extra-curricular sports activities. A girl becomes eligible for membership when she accumulates 100 points or makes her second all star team.
