Co-Chairmen of Follies Announced

Theme of Follies Is To Remain Secret

Each year in February, the Senior Class of St. Mary's presents an informal production which is known as the Senior Class Follies. This presentation, the theme of which is always kept a secret until the night of the Follies, is an old tradition at St. Mary's, and in former years has been given in satire form.

On Tuesday, October 14, Memrie Mosier and Catherine Potter were selected by the Senior Class officers as co-chairmen of this year's Follies, which is to be given on February 10. Catherine and Memrie's job will include the presenta-

tion of theme ideas to the Senior Class, the selection of various committees, and finally, the direction of the actual production.

Memrie, who is from Greenville, N. C., is the 1958-1959 editor of the Muse. She has been a member of Orchesis for two years, as well as a member of the Choir and of the *Belles* staff.

Catherine comes from Beaufort, N. C., and like Memrie, has also been an Orchesis member for two years. This year she was elected Chief Dance Marshal. Catherine is a hall counselor, a Crucifer, and a member of the Glee Club.

Dr. Stone Receives Honor

On October 17 at the Fifty-ninth General Convention of the Episcopal Church, Dr. Richard G. Stone received the honor of being elected to the National Council of the Episcopal Church. He is the first lay or clerical representative from the Diocese of North Carolina. Election to this office is the highest honor that any layman can receive. The National Council serves both as an advisory group to the Presiding Bishop and as an administrative body to carry out the will of the General Convention. Elected to this council for six year terms are eight bishops, four clergy, four laymen, and one representative of the Women's Division. They meet four times a year for three weeks at Seabury House in Greenwich, Connecticut.

The General Convention, which Dr. Stone attended in Miami, Florida, is the governing body of the Episcopal Church. It is composed of a House of Bishops and a House of Clerical and Lay Deputies which convene every three years. Each diocese elects four laymen and four clergymen to attend the convention, which lasts for two weeks. During this time the delegates attend to various matters pertaining to the church, such as additions or alterations to the church canons or the budget for the coming year.

This convention was the third one which Dr. Stone has attended. For the past two years he has served on the committee of the Theological Seminary. In addition, Dr. Stone had the privilege and honor of being one of four laymen appointed to the committee which nominated the new Presiding Bishop, soon to be installed in office. Dr. Stone is a member of the Church of the Good Shepherd.
