Orchesis and Glee Club Present Their Annual Christmas Programs

This year Orchesis presented "The Little Match Girl" on Tuesday, December 14. The story, written by Hans Christian Anderson, was given in the form of a dance drama.

Under the supervision of Mrs. Bailey, each member choreographed a special dance or group dance. The St. Mary's Glee Club, under the direction of Miss Geraldine Cate, presented its annual Christmas concert on Thursday, December 16, at 8:30 p.m. The program consisted of three parts.

The first part contained works from the early Church—"In Natali Domine" and "Psallite Unigenito" by Praetorius—followed by two songs of contemporary English composers, "Queen of Heaven" by Dunhill, and "Star Candles" by Head. Two other songs completed the group.

The vocal ensemble was joined by the North Carolina State University Glee Club for the second part of the program. Together they sang several selections: the beautiful Advent chorale "Break Forth O Beauteous Heavenly Light" by Bach; "The Shepherd's Carol" by Billings, who was one of the earliest American composers; "Thou Must Leave Thou Lowly Dwelling" from "L'Enfance du Christ" by Berlioz; "The Carol of the Bells"; and the French-Canadian carol "Tell us, Shepherd Maids."

Folk songs and spirited rhythms made up the final part of the program. Here were sung the "Swedish Dance Carol," with a dance by Charlotte Atkinson; "Carol of the Drum" in which Jody Friedburg played the drums; "Rise Up Shepherd and Follow" and "A Rockin' All Night" with guitar accompaniment; "Do You Hear What I Hear?" accompanied by drum and bells; and the completion of the program with "We Wish You a Merry Christmas."

Soloists were: Meg Christian, Donna Crisp, Jody Friedburg, Noell Johnson, Ann Lashley, Libba Massey, and Dottie Nahikian.
