SYMPOSIUM PRESENTED BETTY CLICK

On January 11th and 12th, a symposium on "Freedom and Responsibility" was presented in the auditorium at St. Mary's. The symposium, sponsored by the Department of Religion, was led by the Reverend W. R. Smith, III. The Reverend Smith is the pastor of the Milner Presbyterian Church in Raleigh and the husband of "Bible" Smith.

The symposium consisted of three lectures, each concerning a different aspect of freedom and responsibility in daily living. The first lecture was presented at 10:30 on Tuesday morning and was concerned with setting up the ground work for the symposium. In his first lecture, Mr. Smith outlined several basic assumptions and defined freedom as "the ability to take a hand in one's own development." The second lecture dealt with freedom and responsibility in vocation and avocation and in the love relationship. It was chiefly concerned with the question: "With whom am I going to spend my life?"

The second lecture was followed by voluntary group discussions in the Ragland Building.

The third and final lecture was presented Wednesday morning at ten o'clock. Mr. Smith discussed freedom and responsibility in one's religion and faith.

Mr. Smith suggested that the symposium be undertaken on an annual basis varying the topic from year to year.
