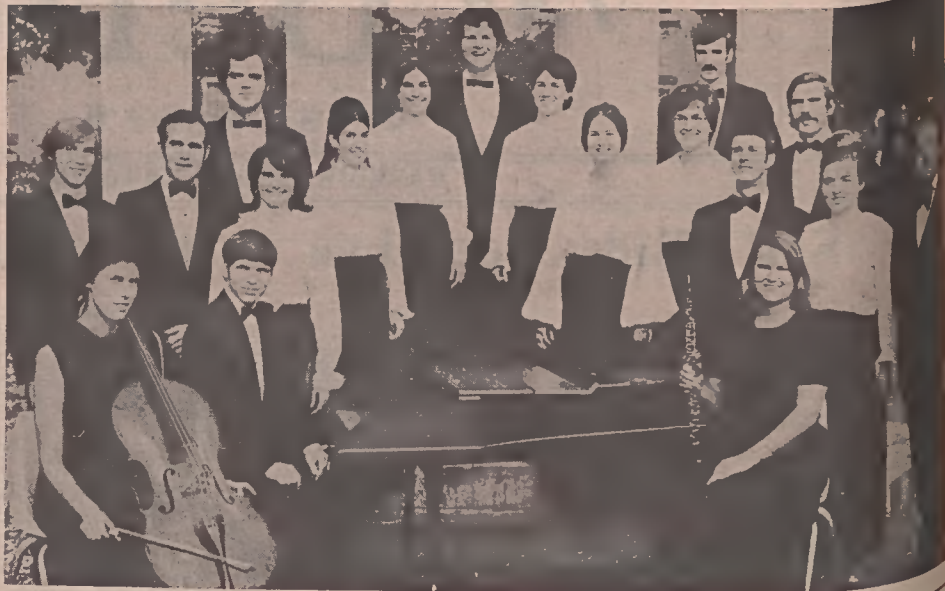


# MUSICAL NOTES: UNIVERSITY CHAMBER SINGERS TO PERFORM

St. Mary's has a varied schedule of musical events planned for the remainder of the year. On Sunday, April 8, at 8 p.m. the University Chamber Singers from Chapel Hill will appear in concert in Pittman Auditorium. Directed by Stafford Wing, the group will first perform several 20th century works entitled "madrigals and chansons". These will be followed by lute songs and medieval French chansons. Pianist Michael Zenge, of the Music Department Faculty of UNC, will join the singers after intermission in performance of Brahms' "Zigeunerlieder," opus 103. The Chamber Singers are acclaimed as exceptional singing musicians and will certainly give an enjoyable concert. Admission is free and the public is invited. The concert will not be required, but it is hoped that there will be enough interested students that we can provide an audience of "measurable size" for this fine group.
