Five Wins, Four Ties, And One Loss Turned In By Whelps; Fox Leads Scoring

One of the best aggregations to represent Mars Hill on the gridiron in several years, wound up their 1932 schedule when the Lions gave the Biltmore Bulldogs a 21-0 lacing in the annual Thanksgiving Day classic. By trampling the Bulldogs, this year's team hung up one of the best records to be turned in by a Roberts machine Rabb's drop-kick that tied the game, in several seasons.

Good Record

This season's summary shows five wins, four ties, and one defeat. The lone reverse score of the season was registered when Weaver's Tornado took the Lions' into camp for a 21 to 6 beating, on Armistice Day. According to available statistics, every other Mars Hill eleven has dropped at least two contests.
