FORENSIC TEAM ENDS A SUCCESSFUL SEASON

Squad Enters Three Tournaments During Year; Win Many First Places.

Winning honors in three tournaments, the forensic squad, under the direction of Professor J. B. Huff, debate coach, and Miss Bonnie Wengert, head of the Expression Department, has had a most successful season.

Speakers have entered the Strawberry Leaf Festival of Winthrop college, the Appalachian State Tournament at Boone, and The North Carolina Junior College Forensic Tournament at Catawba college.

The season was opened in November with the sending of a delegation to the North Carolina Student Legislative Assembly in Raleigh. Over one hundred students, representing 18 colleges and universities in North Carolina, attended the conference, which was the first of its kind in the South.

Eddie Lieberman won the Dixie championship for the second straight year in the Strawberry Leaf Festival at Winthrop college in December, competing with senior college speakers from a wide area. Flowers Clark won first place in the second round of debating; John Ball, Warren Smith, Thomas Freeman, Jesse Moore, Ruth Martin, and Eugene

W. Huff, registrar, announced that 150 students would receive diplomas this year. This is the largest graduating class in the history of the school. Last year 141 students graduated.

The baccalaureate sermon will be delivered on May 22 in the First Baptist church. The speaker for the occasion has not been selected but he will be announced in the next few days.
