His bill called for immediate declaration of war against the axis powers and was defeated. S. in a war he wouldn't have to fight. But as the paper said, Hope is still a pre-law student and still playing a large part in student affairs in North Carolina.

President **pro-tem** C. C. Hope, Wake Forest and Mars Hill, handed the gavel of the State Student Senate back to Norman Caudle of Mars Hill.

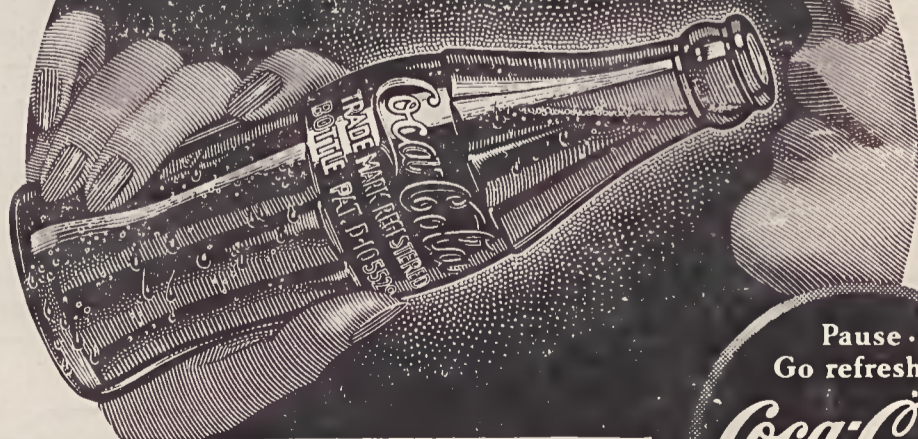
