Eight student representa-tives brilliantly upheld Mars tives brilliantly upheld Mars Hill's already firmly established Grand Eastern forensic record. This year the Grand Eastern Forensic Tournament was held in Charlotte on April 6-7-8 under the sponsorship of Winthrop College of Rock Hill, S. C. Mars Hill brought back more than one-third of the Grand Eastern Chamthe Grand Eastern Cham-pionships, winning eight of the twenty-one that were awarded.
