the clear and raced 42 yards to the Bulldog 5. But stiffening resistance, coupled with Bulldog tenacity, held the Lions on the 1. After Raines punted out to mid-field, play see-sawed back and forth between the 40 yard markers for the remainder of the half, Mars Hill leading 9 to 6.

Starting things off with a bang in the third frame, the Lions drove to the Bulldog 19, where the visitors took over and immediately forfeited the ball on another fumble, J. C. Mitchell recovering on the 9. Three plays later, Cushwa bucked over center from the 1 for the tally. Wood's placement was wide, but the Lions took a commanding 15 to 6 lead.

Wood Goes Over

Five minutes into the fourth stanza, a pass by Raines was intercepted by Al Dennis, under-study fullback, on the Bulldog's 43. On the next play, Art Wood broke loose and scampered 43 yards for the Lions' third score. The attempted conversion was blocked, but the Lions held their winning 21 to 6 margin.

Play rocked back and forth near midfield for the fleeting minutes of the game, Mars Hill emerging victorious by a 21 to 6 count.

The outstanding backs of the day's game, as well as those of the week previous, were Chick Martin and George Cushwa, whose jet-propelled running and hard-hitting defense set the Bulldog's back on their heels.

Mitchell Stars

The Lineman of the day was J. C. Mitchell, Morganton center; his deadly tackling and sure-fire blocking rocked the Bulldogs throughout the game.

The bulk of the offensive and defensive duties of the Bulldogs' was carried by speedy Cecil Bolick and scatback Carroll Raines, who completed 5 of the invaders' 6 passes.
