## Grid Rivals To Meet For Second Time This Year

### Ramsey Promises Heavy Prep Drills

Mars Hill College's Mountain Lions, after battling Appalachian "B" to a scoreless deadlock under rainy skies in a game here earlier this season, will take a second crack at Coach Flucie Stewart's Mountaineers when the locals travel to Boone, N. C., for their third consecutive engagement away from the home field, Friday afternoon, November 15.

The Lions, emerging from Saturday's game without any serious injuries, should be at top strength when they take to the field for the only grid opponent to play the Mars Hillians in two games this season.

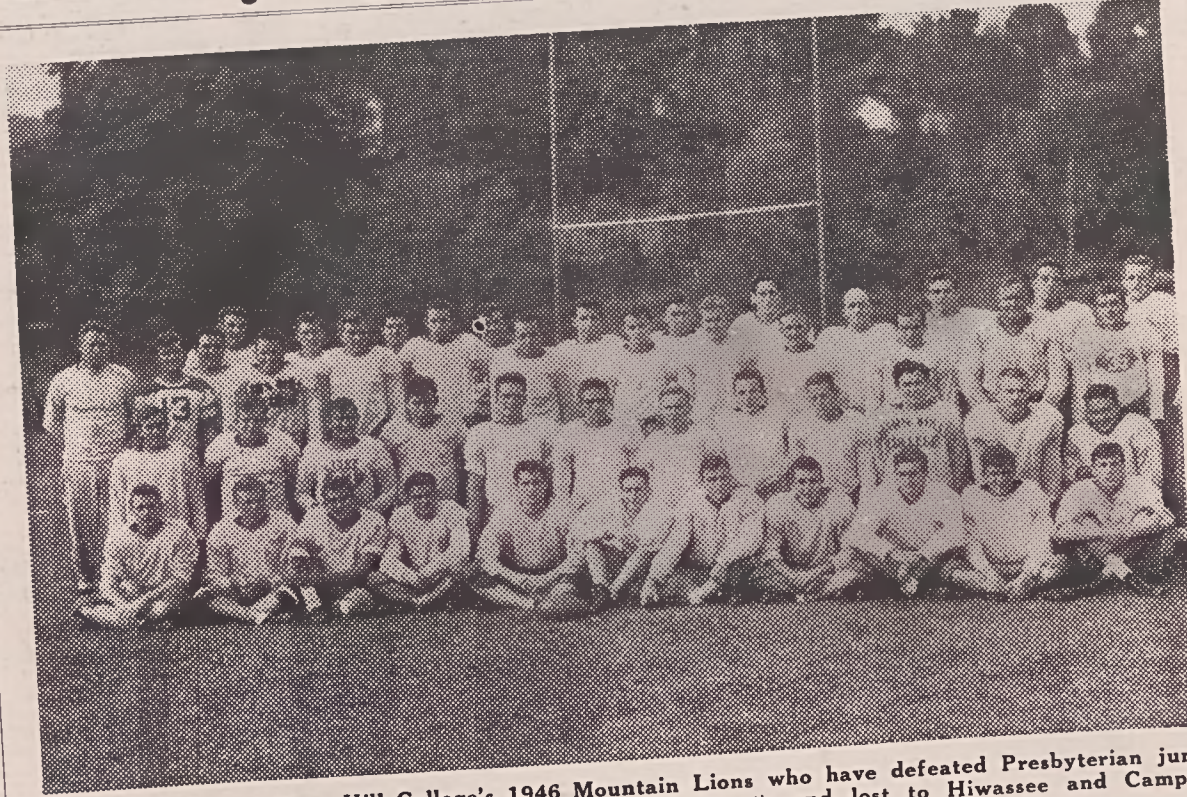
### Ramsey Promises Drill

Coach Ramsey, none too satisfied with the performances of some of his players last Saturday and despite the 14 to 0 victory, promised "plenty of long and drills" in preparation for this return engagement with the Mountaineers.

The Appalachian reserves operate from the always fast and tricky "T" formation and can resort to the airways if their ground attack bogs down.

For the locals, the game will mark the final contest on the road and conclusion of a three-game series played away from the Mars Hill field.

The Lions play host to Brevard in a renewal of age-old football rivalry between the two Western North Carolina junior colleges here Saturday afternoon, November 23, in the final game of the season.

## Martin, Sluder Spark Mars Hill Over Cats, 14-0

### Lions Score Third Victory Of Season

Banner Elk, Nov. 9.—Fullback Martin, running left guard in the Lions' opening play of the game, dashed 57 yards to touchdown glory behind near-perfect blocking; and Leonard Sluder intercepted a Bobcat pass, skirted 76 yards to sideline chalk, and reached the promised land to give Mars Hill College's Mountain Lions a 14-0 victory over Lees-McRae here this afternoon before 1,200 football fans.

It was Mars Hill's third grid triumph of the year and fifth junior college conference game.

### Opening Tally

The first quarter was but seconds old when Martin, taking the ball of the initial play, sped through his hole in the side of the Bobcat line, picked up interference, and fled 57 yards to the Lions' opening tally. Wood split the uprights for the extra point and Mars Hill had the lead which they never relinquished.

Sluder added the other touchdown late in the second period. The rangy back snagged a Lees-McRae aerial on the Lions' 24 and threaded the left boundary marker for 76 thrilling yards to cross the goal line standing up for six more points. Again, Wood place-kicked the extra marker and the scoring story of the game was over.

### Bobcats Show Life

The second half, although scoreless, was not without its thrilling moments, especially for the Lees-McRae supporters. The Bobcats used spasmodic flashes of striking power on the ground, yardage gained by heavy penalties against the Lions, and a Mars Hill fumble on the locals' 23, made desperate efforts to initiate a sustained march. The Lions halted every threat.

At half time, Mars Hill College's Band, under the direction of Miss Mary Stringfield, and many of Mountain Lions' majorettes, interested Godfrey and Peggy Shumaker, paraded for the spectators.

## Lions Prepare For Cage Season

With the football season nearing its close, basketball is beginning to take over the limelight. The Lions' intramural league plans to get under way November 7, with the first two contests of the first cage loop at Mars Hill since before the war. Prospects for the varsity squad have been working out and Coach Ramsey has singled out a few that seem to look like starters already. The schedule, except for four tentative games, is complete and has been released by Coach Ramsey.

The Mars Hill Lions took the junior college crown last season, and with things looking as well as they do now, they should be able to capture that honor again this year. With hopes of rounding out the best team at Mars Hill in many years, Ramsey has scheduled 22 hard games to date.
