Several of the administrative personnel and faculty members have recently represented Mars Hill College in high school College Day programs throughout North Carolina, South Carolina, and Virginia.

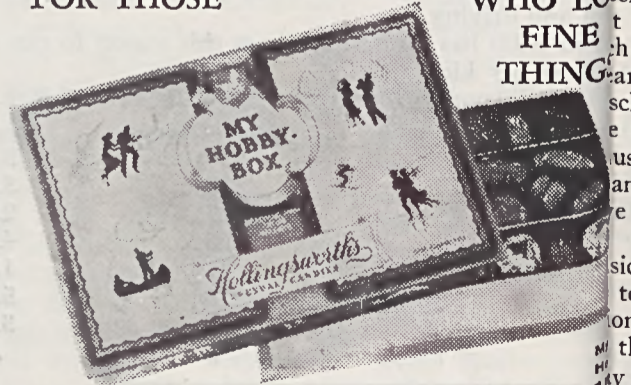
