College Union Construction Continues

Cornwall Hall and the College Union building, under construction on the campus, are scheduled for official opening at commencement in May, according to Miss Francis Snelson, assistant to the president of the college. Lending institutions require that the college raise 25% of the building cost and provide furnishings before occupying these structures. However, the furnishings have already been ordered and the opening is expected to be on schedule.

Cornwall Hall, opposite the academic quadrangle, will house offices for the departments of business administration, English, history, modern language, and religion in

addition to six classrooms and two laboratories, one for modern languages, the other for English. It was contracted to the Burncombe Construction Company and will be completed with landscaping and furnishings at a total cost of \$510,000. The College Union building, costing the college \$1,315,000, landscaped and furnished, was contracted to Engineers-Constructors, a division of Rittenback Construction of Knoxville, Tenn. This particular division of Rittenback allows for hiring of non-union labor.
