#### CONSIDER...

According to an Official List of Endangered Species, there are 31 species of fishes 8 species of reptiles and amphibians, 17 species of mammals, and 54 species of bird which stand the possibility of extinction. Included in this list is the Eastern timber wolf, Columbian white-tailed deer, the American alligator, and the whooping crane.

In a summary published by the National Wildlife Federation, it is stated,"We are robbing our U.S. wildlife of living space as well as polluting their environment." For example, more than 150,000 birds die annually in the oil field sumps alone. In a recent study of one oil sump there were 187 victims — 90 songbirds, 87 ducks one owl, one egret, five geese, and three herons.
