you've heard that freshmen at Mars Hill are involved in something called a "competence - based curriculum". Do you why that know strange sounding animal is? Could you explain it to someone else? It not, read and maybe further learn you'll more which that about you've trapped yourself into.

One way of attemptint to understand the new curriculum is to compare it to the curriculum former Under the previous curriculum, students graduated from Mars Hill College by completing the courses required by the core decurriculum, or partmental majors. Under the new curriculum, only the Mentor Seminar is required as a specific course. A11 other requirements are stated in terms of competences to be deand the monstrated student chooses learning experiences he or she needs from suggested courses offered by the college. Under the competence-based curricustudents will lum, still take courses, engage in independent study, participate in interships and enjoy educational travel as they now do. The difference is that these learning experiences will be selected according to the learning needs of individual students as they seek to at-

culum will bring together the many diverse learning experiences offered by the sollege into a consistent whole so that a student's education will be less fragmented. In addition, where students already have knowledge and skills relevant to the college competence requirements, thye would receive certification of the possession of such competences and build upon them rather than duplicate previously gained competence.

general The six competences to re required of students at. Mars Hill derive from six broad areas of meaning in which mankind has sought to arrange his experience and achieve better understanding. These areas are basic symbolic communication, science, aesthetics, personal and cultural value, personal knowledge and synoptic knowledge. Students will be led to explore and develope competences in approaching themtheir selves and world from each of these six basic frameworks. The competences go beyond requiring knowledge these six about realms of meaning to specify experience in developing skills in each realm.

The competences, as presently developed, are as follows: 1) A graduate of Mars Hill College is competent in communication skills.

3) A graduate of Mars Hill College comprehends the major values of his own culture, the major values of one alternative culture, and can analyze relationships between the major values of at least two cultures.

4) A graduate of Mars Hill College understands the nature of aesthetic perception and is aware of the significance of creative and aesthetic dimensions of his own experience.

5) A graduate of Mars Hill understands the basic elements of the scientific method of inquiry and applies this understanding by acquiring, identifying and analyzing information which leads to scientific conclusions.

6) A graduate of Mars Hill College has examined several attempts to achieve a world view unified and knows how such attempts are made. The graduate is aware of the broad questions that have been posed in the history, philosophy and religion of the western civilization and can asses the validity of answers given to these broad questions in terms of internal consistency, compara-
