Yes ma'am, I quit that job. It was the most ridiculous place I've ever been in!



his tuition for the next semester and half will be for the test. The cost for auditing a course will be 30 dollars per credit hour.

The second proposal adopted by the faculty concerns suspension of a student for academic reasons. "At the end of each session, any fulltime student who has failed to complete five full courses, which may include the short term (20 semester hours) with at least a "c" in the preceding twelve months will be suspended for a minimum of one regular semester." This will not apply to freshmen and students who interrupt their college program until twelve months after they have enrolled as fulltime students. Students who are suspended from school for academic reasons may make application for readmission after one full semester and any student may appeal his case to the Committee on Admissions and Academic Standards.
