## MHC RECEIVES \$3,000 FROM KODAK FOR GRANTS

Mars Hill-Mars Hill College president Dr. Fred B. Bentley was presented a \$3,000 unrestricted direct grant Friday from Eastman Kodak's 1974 Educational Aid Program.

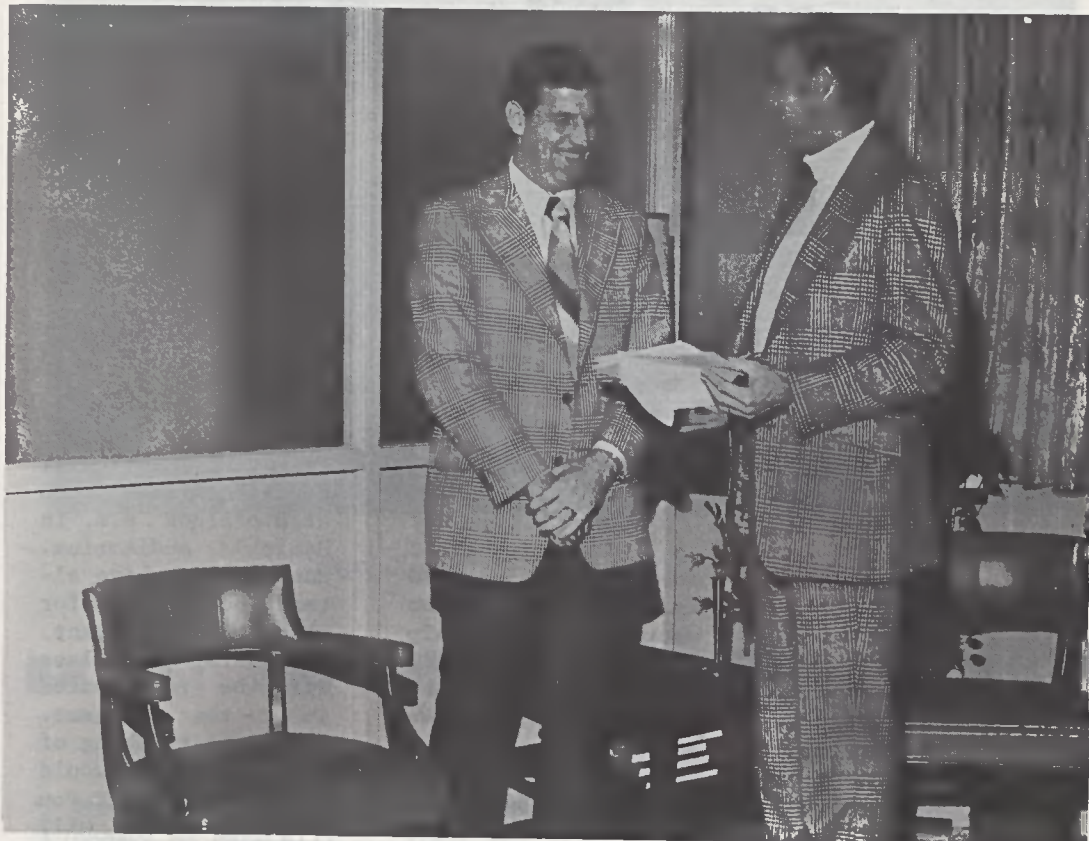
Kodak's program awards grants based on the number of graduates from institutions who join Kodak within five years of their graduation and who are currently in their fifth year of employment. Kodak contributes \$750 for each undergraduate or graduate year completed at a privately supported school. This year, Kodak has awarded \$735,000 in unrestricted direct grants to privately supported institutions.

The grant was made in the name of Stanley R. Sellstrom, an Asheville native who joined Tennessee Eastman Company in 1969, following his graduation from Mars Hill. Sellstrom is a cost accountant with the Kingsport firm. Harold Corn, also an alumnus, made the presentation.

Kodak's commitment to higher education

is long-standing, dating back to the early 1900's. It's Education Aid Program was formally established in 1955 and has expanded to meet the mounting financial pressures of educational institutions and the need of society for capable graduates from these institutions.

The Educational Aid Program includes: unrestricted direct grants that help defray an institution's cost of educating college students now employed by Kodak; grants for graduate education and research at the doctoral level in chemistry, physics, engineering and interdisciplinary fields; special grants to major college and universities for capital improvements, and endowment campaigns and to liberal arts schools offering curricula of particular interest to the company and located near the company's major manufacturing and administrative facilities; and contributions to selected educational associations that foster the goals of education.
