



New Media Heads Chosen For 76-77

Following a special meeting to consider a protest by two of the applicants, the Board for Student Communications has announced the new editors/managers for the four student communications media. In an unprecedented move, the board overturned/ the original balloting for the position of editorship of the HILLTOP.

The protest came about in the following manner: two of the board members--- Jon Riddle and Rex Best, co-editors of this year's Laurel-- who were also applicants for the Hilltop position, were denied their right to vote through an oversight.

The oversight came as a result of the board's practice of asking the applicants to leave the room following their interview by the board while the vote is taken. Best and Riddle

left the room without voting. After the initial vote, which favored Jim Baker by a close margin, Best and Riddle protested that they had not been allowed to vote, which, as members of the board, they had the right to do. This initial meeting was on Wednesday, April 14.

On Wednesday, April 21, a special meeting of the board was called to consider their protest. It was decided by the entire board that their protest was valid, that the question should be reconsidered, that the board members who were voluntarily absent for the original meeting (thus missing the interviews) would not be allowed to vote, and that the vote would be taken again allowing the two to vote. The ensuing ballot showed that Riddle and Best had won by a larger than expected margin.

Plans have been announced for the March of Dimes Madison County Jogathon by Bill Shetley, Campaign Chairman for Pisgah Chapter. The Fellowship of Christian Athletes and the Wren College Union of Mars Hill College are sponsoring the event which will be held on Saturday, May 1, 1976, 10:00 a.m., at the Mars Hill College track.

The Jogathon will be open to all who would like to participate. Joggers will solicit pledges at a monetary rate per lap jogged. Each jogger will be presented with a certificate stating how far they jogged for the March of Dimes, and trophies

will be given to winners in various categories.

As an added attraction, 13 year-old Donny Buffkin, of Jacksonville, Florida, will be at the College track on May 1, attempting to break the world record for pogo stick jumping. He has won the championship previously, but his record has been recently broken. He will have to jump 65,000 times to break the new record.

The Board for Student Communications is composed of the editors/managers of each of the media, advisors to each medium, representatives from each of the four academic classes, a representative from the

faculty, the Dean of Student Development, and a representative from the Student Government Association.

In other actions, the position of editor of the Cadenza went to John Gullick, a rising senior Art major from Greenville, S.C.; Margaret Doutt, a rising junior Music major from Canton, and Deborah Queen, a rising senior History major from Bostic were elected co-editors of the 1976-77 Laurel; and Neil Moore, a Charlotte native and rising senior English major was named manager of WVMH-FM.
