On March 6 the petitions should be turned in to the S. G. A. Office by way of Box No. 1, 294, 1458, or 796.


During the week of March 6-9 campaigning will begin. This is to be climaxed on March 10 by election speeches given in the cafeteria.

Class officer petitions for President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer will need 100 signatures and the senators will need 50 signatures. The names of the candidates running will be given to the current presidents of the classes so that campaign speeches may be done before Spring Break with elections being held on April 10.

The officers to be elected will be Class President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, and 2 Senators at large from each class.
