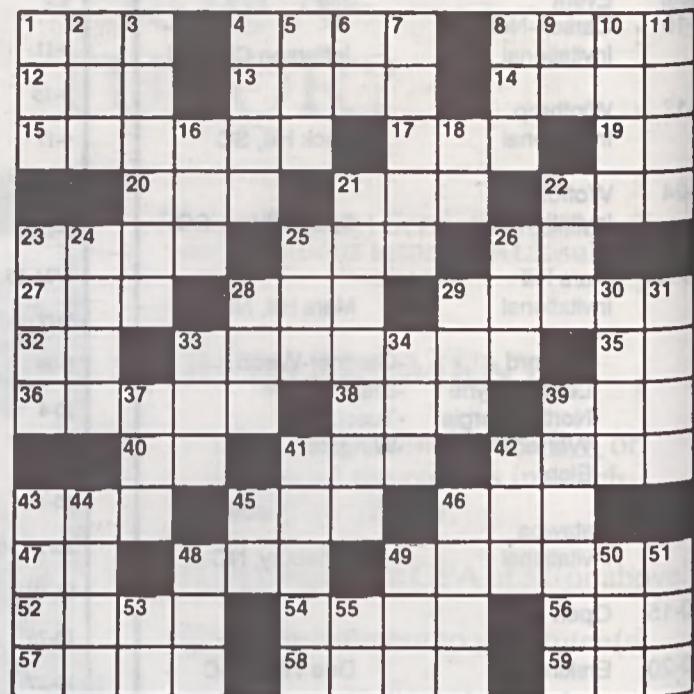
McWharton has dedicated herself to spreading the word of God to the most loved and not so loved citizens of America. She is highly recommended as a great storyteller who will captivate her audiences.

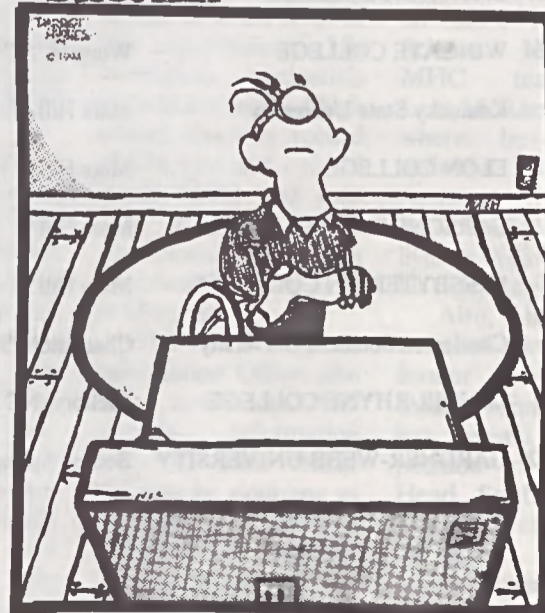
