It descends into the amphitheater known as the Circue de Gavarnie. This is a basin more than two miles wide tains rising from 7,000 to 9,000 feet. The proportions of the place are mammoth, in keeping with the singular characteristics of this waterfall. Gavarnie is in the Pyrenees, not far from either Pau or Luchon.-Exchange.
