Thadius Bradley is the owner of a his family, which is of particular interest to note at this time, since the sheet was devoted principally to the Gen. George Washington, whose grant: death took place a few weeks before the printing of this paper.

The four page published at Kingston. (Ulster Co.), on January 4th, 1800, was known as "Ulster County Gazette" and published by Samuel Freer and son. A large part of the paper is heavily bordered in black in token of the passing of the great statesman and President.

Another valuable and interesting newspaper in Mr. Bradley's possesed in New York April 30th, 1889. and is a copy of the last edition of the Centennial Extra, the occasion! being the one hundredth birthday of the constitutional government of the United States of America.

This paper has broad bands of red and blue against the white, symbolic of the National colors, and it contains interesting accounts of the nation's jubilee anniversary.
