Miss Macie Goodman spent the week-end in Raleigh.

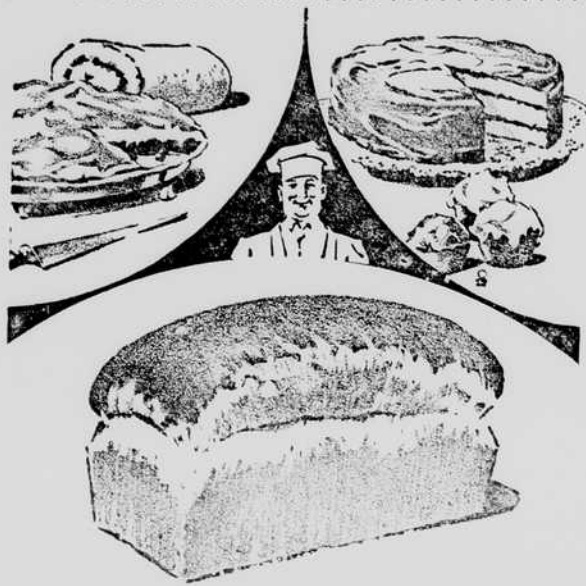

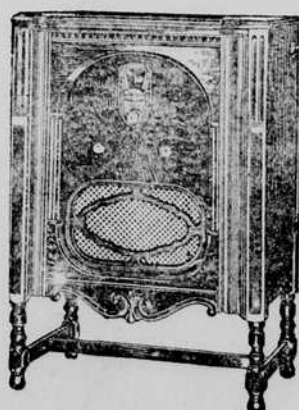
