Births Nearly Double Deaths In Halifax

There were nearly twice as many children born in Halifax County last year as there were deaths, according to figures compiled by the State Board of Health. These figures show 1,153 births and 628 deaths.

The State reported a total of 76,905 deaths, with Guilford county leading in the birth rate with 3,091, and Mecklenburg leading in the number of deaths—1,596.

Births in a number of other counties were as follows: Bertie, 679; Edgecombe, 1,190; Franklin, 754; Granville, 714; Hartnett, 1,006; Hyde, 177; Johnston, 1,366; Lenoir, 921; Martin, 728; Nash, 1,407; Northampton, 625; Onslow, 499; Vance, 539; Warren, 678.

Deaths were reported as follows: Harnett, 404; Granville, 386; Franklin, 385; Johnston, 643; Nash, 651; Pitt, 611; Vance, 373; Warren, 341; Hertford, 223; Bertie, 288.

Awakes To Find Burglars Standing By Bed—Shoots One
