COURT NEWS

Eugene Miller, white man of Rosemary, received a four months road sentence when he pleaded guilty of driving a car while intoxicated. Miller was a member of the construction crew which is building the bridge across the Roanoke.

Noah Carver, white man of Rosemary paid a fine of \$25 and costs for being caught taking a drink of liquor.

Paul Massey, white man of Roanoke Rapids plead guilty to the possession of liquor and stated that it belonged to Raymond Acree and Hinton Faison for whom he was working, both of whom have the reputation of being bootleggers and who are in jail awaiting to be tried on a like charge.

W. T. Chittenden, white man of Roanoke Rapids was given a good reputation when he came into court upon a charge of having whiskey in

his possession. He was taking a little drink when one of the minions of the law came along. The drink cost him \$25 and the costs of court.

C. R. Long and A. R. Tant, white men of Roanoke Rapids, got six months vacation on the roads in which to rest up from the labors of their alleged occupation of operating a home brew plant and dispensary. Long plead guilty to the making and selling of the beverage while Tant admitted aiding and abetting in the enterprise. The men were arrested August 2nd at Deep Creek near Roanoke Rapids, when their eagerness to build trade got them the wrong customers. They sold a stein of brew to Chief Dobbins and Harry House of Roanoke Rapids. The officers, figuring there was more where that came from, investigated and discovered a quantity of yeast and malt near the place.

Acy Barnes plead guilty to assaulting John Vinson with a club and drew a six month road sentence. Barnes claims that Vinson cursed the former's nine year old child. Both were white men of near Rosemary.

A jury said that Edward Joyner, a young white man of Rosemary, was guilty of carelessly and recklessly driving an automobile. The case grew out of a collision between a delivery truck driven by Joyner and a car driven by T. Zollicoffer, negro, several months ago about one mile from Rosemary. 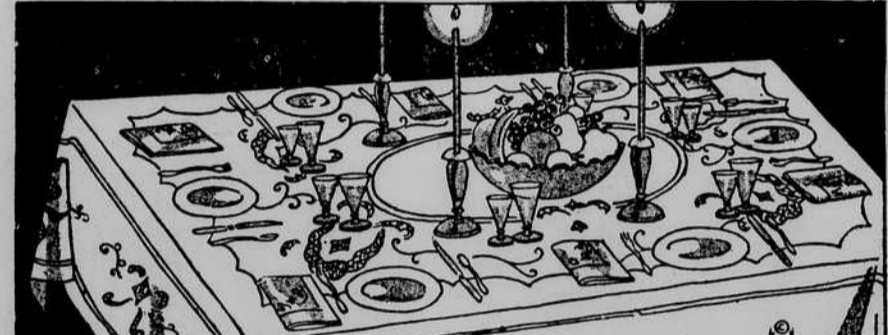
