



Jackets Drop To Third Place In Conference

LEAD IN 1ST HALF

Lose Hard Fought Tilt To Elizabeth City 21-7 When Injuries Wreck Team

The Yellow Jackets lost a hard fought game to Elizabeth City here last Friday 21-7, but in doing so, covered themselves with glory, for Coach Hoyle sent one of the hardest fighting teams out on the field that has represented the local High School in many years.

Roanoke Rapids was lucky to hold the score down to 21-7. Elizabeth City sent a veteran outfit here to uphold their first place in the Northeastern Conference.

Led by Lee Davis, the quarterback, the visitors tore through the Jackets for three touchdowns in the last half to come out on the long end of the score. The game was all in Roanoke Rapids' favor during the first half but once the second half had started injuries put the whole local outfit on the blink. Sullivan went out with injuries followed by Garrahn Starks, then Womble, Roanoke Rapids left end, went out with a broken nose, followed by Fred Mills, crack fullback for the Jackets, then Cullom and Matthews went out with injuries, leaving the Yellow Jackets with a flock of second string men in the lineup.

Elizabeth City with Davis leading the attack would have probably won the game anyway but the Rapids would have held them to two touchdowns and would have stood a chance to win with the regulars in the lineup. The Yellow Jackets scored first on a short right end run with Jimmy Womble carrying the oval. He cut back through the line and galloped thirty yards for a touchdown, not a single Elizabeth City player laying a hand on him. It was a nice run with Jimmy's team mates clearing the path for him with marvelous interference.

Roanoke Rapids made a wonderful stand on their own goal line during the third period to stave off a touchdown, the locals holding the visitors on the four yard stripe for four downs. Womble punted out to the 35 yard line and Davis fumbled, Colon Womble falling on the ball. Roanoke Rapids run one play and Mills fumbled, the ball bouncing around on the field for a few seconds before an Elizabeth City man fell on it. Davis led the charge for a touchdown and scored the extra point. He scored later on two wide end runs to finally make the score 21-7.

Clyde Mills and "Country" Brown returned to top for this game and played the best game they have played this year. Mills and Brown constantly smearing Elizabeth City's plays behind the line of scrimmage. Cullom also played a whale of a game for the Rapids. Womble on end and McNeil on end both stood out for Roanoke Rapids. For the visitors Parker and Mead stood out in the line, while Davis was the outstanding attraction in the backfield. "Scopy" Dickens, sent in for Capt. Starks, run twice with the ball and gained eight yards in two tries, while playing a nice defensive game.





