

NEW DIAL PHONE NUMBERS OF Twin City Business Firms Arranged and Classified INSTRUCTIONS How To Use The New DIAL PHONES

1. Remove receiver from hook and listen for "dial tone" which is represented by a steady hum. The dial tone indicates your line is clear and ready for dialing, and if tone is received, proceed to dial desired number.
2. If, after having dialed a number and you hear an intermittent buzzing sound, it is what is called "busy tone," and indicates the telephone you have dialed is in use or busy.
3. If you wish to make several calls, hold your receiver down for about five seconds after each call and before dialing again. This will give all switches time to release. The receiver hook should, of course, be released each time before dialing.

Notice of Hearing on A Petition to Create A Sanitary District

A petition having been filed with the Board of County Commissioners for the creation of a sanitary district for the purpose of acquiring, constructing, maintaining and operating a sewerage system, a sewerage disposal or treatment plant, a water supply system, a water purification or treatment plant and such other utilities as may be necessary for the preservation and promotion of the public health and sanitary welfare within the district pursuant to Chapter 100 of the Public Laws of 1927 with the following boundaries: All territories lying within the corporate limits of the Town of Roanoke Rapids, Halifax County, North Carolina, and all of the portion of Roanoke Rapids Township, Halifax County, North Carolina, not embraced within said corporate limits, but lying contiguous thereto within the following boundaries and lines to-wit: Bounded on the South by the Northern line of the Seaboard Air Line Railway Company right-of-way; on the East by the Western line of Marshall Street as extended to the Seaboard Air Line Railway Company right-of-way and Roanoke River; on the North by the Southern bank of the Roanoke River and on the West by the Eastern line of an alley twenty (20) feet wide and one hundred forty (140) feet distant to the West of the Western line of Rapids Street as extended to Roanoke River and the right-of-way of the Seaboard Air Line Railway Company, notice is hereby given that a public hearing on the said petition will be held by the Board of County Commissioners at Halifax, N. C., on the 9th day of Jan., 1931, at 10 o'clock, A. M.
