Newton, who started at center in place of Brown let Gautier shoot three field goals in the first quarter for Washington. Brown then came in but the big center of the visiting team accounted for eleven points in all for his part of the game and helped with many more by his passing and floor work.

Washington showed two All Conference guard material in Credle and Carrow; both of them played an outstanding game and along with Gautier were responsible for the Jackets' third straight slide towards the bottom. Matthews, who holds down a forward for the Jackets, shot six points for his team and was high scorer for them.
