## Wallace Beery In Gangster Thriller For Fri.-Sat. Bill

With Charlie Chaplin, the genius of fun, heading the bill at the Peoples Theatre for next week in his latest production; "City Lights," next comes Robert Montgomery in "Shipmates," a new and novel navy story, which is said to firmly establish Montgomery as a star in his own right.

Montgomery, who has long been a favorite with local theatre-goers, is prepared to give a really superb characterization of "Jonesy," a navy seaman, who isn't so enthused about being in the navy, however, it develops he "falls" for the admiral's daughter, and some novel situations present themselves. "Shipmates" will play Wednesday and Thursday at the Roanoke Rapids playhouse, and the program will of course include the usual run of short subjects.

For the last half of the week, Manager Lyle M. Wilson has booked "The

Secret Six." A new and different gangster picture, starring Wallace Beery and Lewis Stone, and including in the cast Jean Harlow, the beautiful blond sensation of "Hell's Angels," and Clark Gable, recently seen here in Joan Crawford's latest picture "Dance Fools, Dance."

Although Gable portrayed the part of the gangster "big shot" in the picture with Miss Crawford, he is quite the opposite in the later film, playing the part of a reporter who is strictly "on the square." "The Secret Six" is undoubtedly one of the best gangster pictures of the year, and though it comes here at Bargain Day prices, it played most of the larger houses in the state only a few short weeks ago at first-run prices.

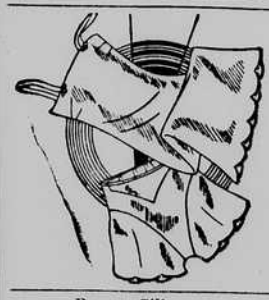
