SEVERAL SENTENCED TO ROADS

This week in Recorders court there were several cases which had been suspended. In each case the defendant was given a road sentence. The majority of the cases were larceny and assault.

On November 17, 1931 John Lowe was adjudged guilty in the Recorder's Court on a warrant charging him with Jarceny and judgment was entered that the defendant enter in a bond in the sum of \$200 for appearance the first Tuesday in every month for two years and show that he has behaved and that he has not violated the law in any respect. 
