## Audit Report

Raleigh, Feb. 20 .- North Carolina's general fund expenditures for the month of January were more than \$1,500,000 in excess of the receipts, the result being a cash overdraft January 31 of \$699,792.98, while the highway and other special funds showed a drop of nearly two million dollars, to a balance of \$3,390,850.18 at the end of January, the combined statement of the Auditor and Treasurer, issued Saturday, shows. The general fund shows a cash balance January 1 of \$840,437.61, with receipts for the month of \$3,-992,766.54, making a total of \$4,-733,214.15, but the disbursements during the month were \$5,432,-\$699,792.98 for the month.

The highway fund had a balance of \$5,214,460.62 January 1 and received \$10,915,112.78 during the month, a total of \$16,129,-573.40, while expenditures were \$12,738,723.22, leaving the balance of \$3,390,850.18 January 31.
