Doris Kenyon, widow of Milton Sills, will marry Arthur Hopkins, Syracuse, N. Y., broker, according to announcement in Hollywood.

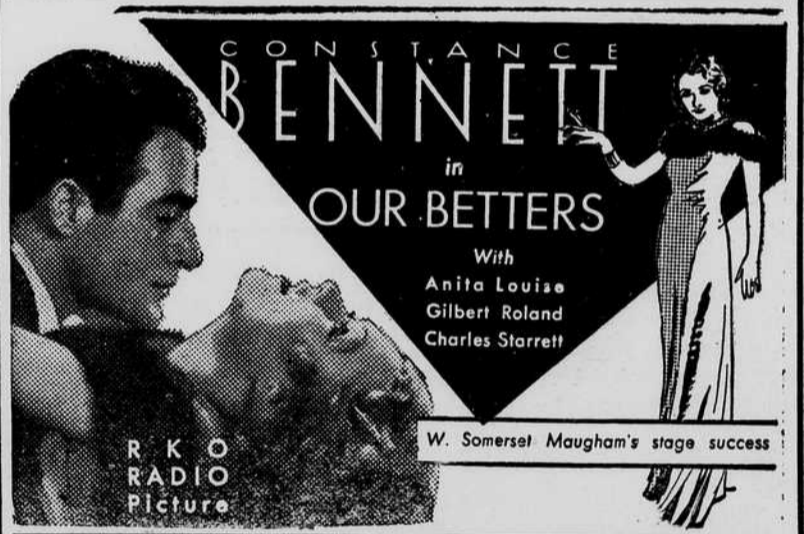
After changing her mind, the girl must return the engagement ring, according to decision rendered in New York state.
