

LAKE THOMAS OPEN JUNE 2

Dance Pavilion; Boating And Bathing At New Resort

Natural Lake Site Developed By Local Men Mile From City

The opening of Roanoke Rapids' newest amusement park will be held Friday evening, June 2nd, with a dance at the newly constructed pavillion near Lake Thomas, about one-mile north and west of the city limits.

The Lake Thomas development has been under the direction of J. H. Hines, local man, who owns the project. Mr. Hines has secured the services of Shearin Crumpler and Edwin Akers to look after his interests this summer, and these young men will be managers of the lake, dance pavillion and park.

With extensive improvements made to an already ideal, natural lake site, the new lake should prove a mecca for bathers and boaters and those wishing to escape the hot sun's rays this summer. It is the only bathing place near the city, with the exception of swimming pool near Rosemary Manufacturing Company.

Altho it has not yet been announced what orchestra will open the pavillion, a number of bands have offered their services, according to Mr. Hines, and announcement in detail will be made next week. It is planned to have regular dances at the pavillion, and some of the Nation's best-known jazz bands will be booked to play them later on in the season.

In addition to the pavillion and bath houses, there will be a cafe on the location, catering to light lunches, and free picnic grounds will be maintained.

Lake Thomas is situated on a creek, just a few yards from the Roanoke River about one-mile from the North boundary of the city limits, on what is known as the old Zollicoffer mill site.

A dam was erected at this place over three years ago, but has been completely re-built by a crew of workmen, and the lake has been cleaned out and materially enlarged. Because of the variation of depth in the lake, ranging from shallowness that will allow small children to wade and play around the water in safety to the deepest point which will permit high diving for more experienced swimmers, it will be an ideal swimming place, and the lakes surface will be ample to permit boating also. A life guard will be on duty at all times.

With a continuous stream of water flowing into the lake from the creek on which it is located, bathers are insured of fresh, clear water at all times. Final arrangements are being made, and the early part of June will see the lake in full operation.
