Because Joseph Reese persisted in courting their sister, Pat and Ed Riston of Belfast sat him on a hot stove.

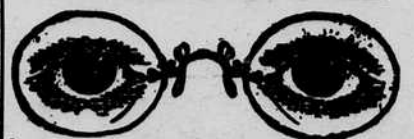
