Mrs. Harry House returned home Sunday after spending several weeks with her parents, Mr. and Mrs. A. B. Baggett of Windsor.

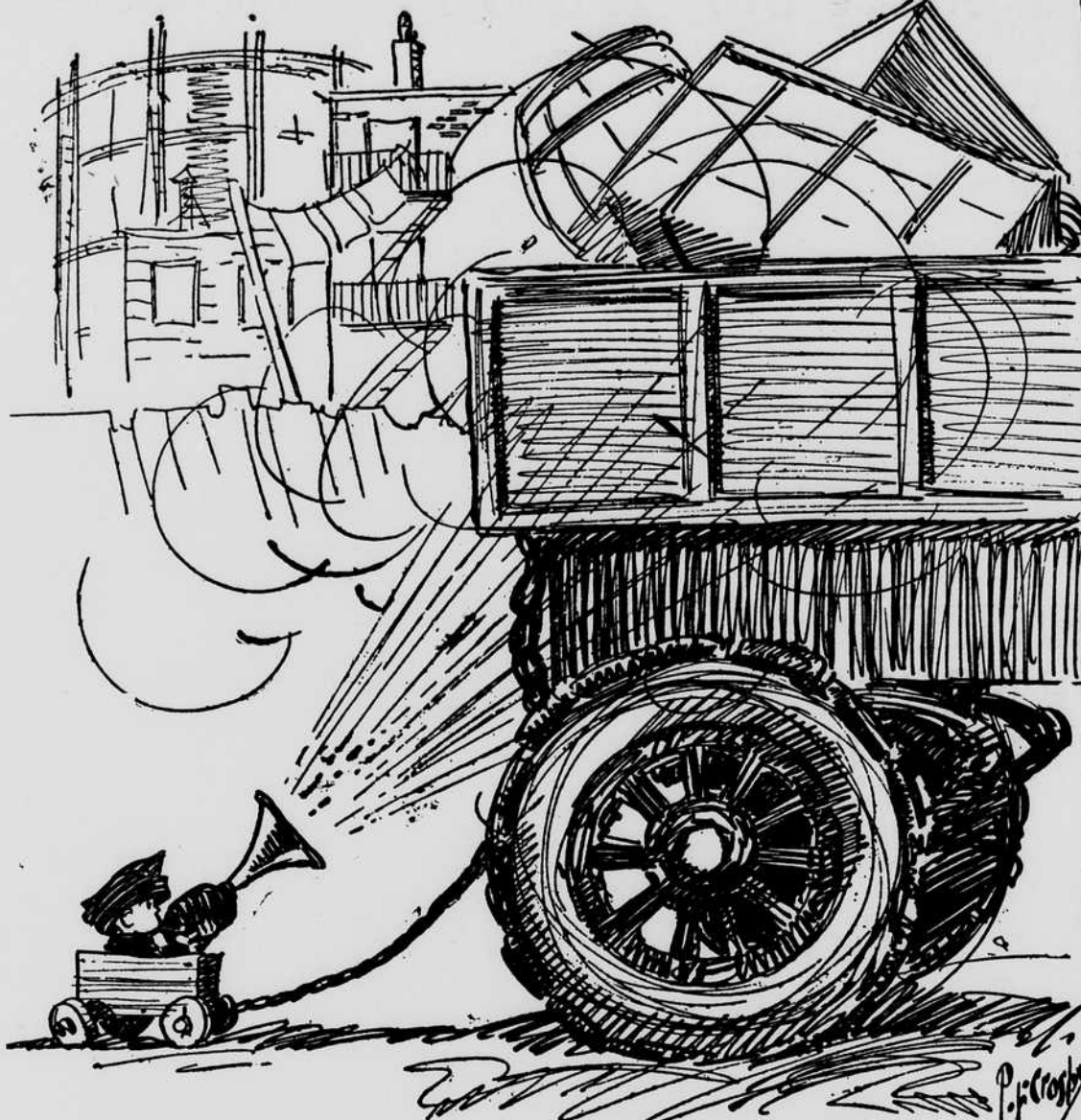

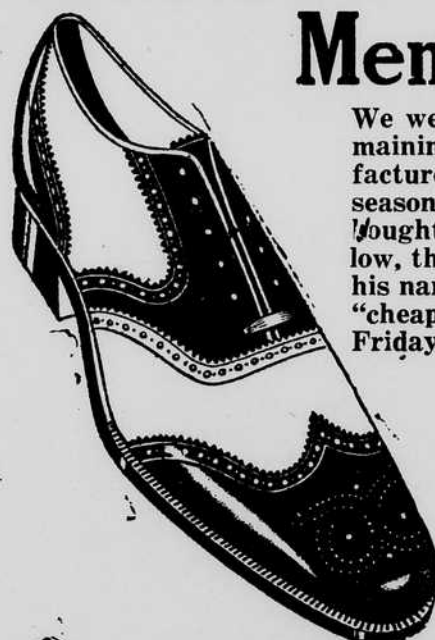
