

"Sweetie Pie" And Other Ways To Cook A Chicken

Individual Chicken Pies

Plain pastry, 1 c. Sliced mushrooms, 4 T. fat, 6 T. Flour, 3 c. chicken stock, 3 c. cooked chicken, cut small. Few grains pepper, one half t. salt.

Line individual pie pans with pastry. Set another pan on top of the pastry to hold it in shape. Bake in a hot oven (425 deg. F) about 10 minutes. Remove the top pan and bake about 5 minutes longer. Brown mushrooms in fat, add flour and stir until well mixed. Add chicken stock and bring to the boiling point, stirring constantly until thick. Add chicken and season to taste with salt and pepper. Fill the baked pastry shells with the chicken mixture. Cover the tops with pastry. Bake the pies in a hot oven (425 deg. F.) about 10 min. or until top is browned. Serve immediately. Makes 6 to 8 pies. (Suggestion: Serve with buttered artichoke hearts, cranberry or currant jelly, celery and coffee mousse.)

Curried Chicken Souffle

4 T. fat, 2 c. cooked chicken, cut fine, 2 c. milk, 2 T. flour, 1 t. salt, Few grains pepper. 1 t. Curry powder, 3 egg yolks, 3 egg whites.

Heat fat, add flour, salt, pepper and curry powder. Add milk, Cook until thick, stirring constantly. Add chicken and mix thoroughly. Pour this mixture over the beaten egg yolks and mix well. Cool slightly. Fold in the stiffly beaten egg whites. Pour into a greased casserole. Bake in a moderate oven (325 deg. F.) 1 hour or until set. Serve immediately.

Chicken Chow Mein

Two-thirds c. shredded onion, 4 T. fat, 2 c. celery, cut in pieces, 2 c. cooked chicken, cut in pieces, Chinese fried noodles, 1 one-half c. chicken stock, 2 c. bean sprouts, 1 t. Chinese brown sauce, 2 T. Chinese soy sauce, 3 T. cornstarch.

Cook the onion in the fat until a delicate brown. Add celery, and cook a few minutes longer. Add the chicken, chicken stock, bean sprouts, brown sauce and soy sauce. (Chinese ingredients may be bought at Chinese or fancy grocery stores, or order by mail). Cook about 10 minutes. Add the cornstarch, mixed to a smooth paste with a little cold water, and stir until thickened. Heat the noodles. Serve the chicken mixture on the noodles.

and fat mixture in the pan. Cool. Remove chicken from bones and cut in rather large pieces. There should be at least 3 c. Place the skin and bones in a kettle and cover with cold water. Cook slowly for 1-2 hr. Strain. Cook mushrooms in the 4 T. fat until a delicate brown. Add flour and mix until smooth, add chicken stock and cook, stirring constantly, until thick. Add chicken and chopped pimiento. (Pimiento can be omitted if desired.) Heat thoroughly. Pour chicken mixture over beaten egg yolks and mix well. Serve in patty shells or on toast or waffles. Cooking Chicken a la King this way gives it an exceptionally rich flavor. (Serve with mixed vegetable salad, hot rolls, lemon ice.)

Big Crop Contest Announced By Fertilizer Distributor

ANNOUNCEMENT has been made locally of a \$5,000 crop contest, open to all farmers. This contest, which is sponsored by the Agricultural Development Bureau of a large distributor of American nitrate of soda, provides for 338 cash prizes. These awards range from the substantial first prize of \$1,000 to \$5.00.

An interesting feature of the contest is the calibre of the men who are to act as honorary judges. They are: Senator Ellison D. Smith, Chairman of the Senate Committee on Agriculture; the Hon. Allen J. Ellender, Speaker of the Louisiana House; and Dr. B. W. Kilgore of Raleigh, N. C., former director of the North Carolina Experiment Station and Extension Service.

Since the prizes are to be based on the answers to five simple questions, with spelling and grammar not counting, the sponsors of the contest feel that every farmer who follows the rules will have an equal chance, regardless of the size of his farm or the fertility of his land. Special prizes are provided for 4-H Club and Future Farmer chapters and fertilizer suppliers who help

their customers win will also be rewarded.

Practically all fertilizer manufacturers and suppliers are active in the contest and can furnish an entry blank to farmers. The only requirement for entering is that the farmer buy at least 100 lbs. of the American product sold by the firm sponsoring the contest.
