In some cases there is no paralysis at all and the disease goes unrecognized unless the spinal fluid is examined.

The death rate is large in epidemics and range from six to 20 per cent. Complete recovery occurs in from 20 to 25 per cent of the cases.

The minimum quarantine period should be three weeks. There is a serum now used which has some value in treatment but medical science is working day and night trying to isolate the germ which passes thru the finest filter they possess.

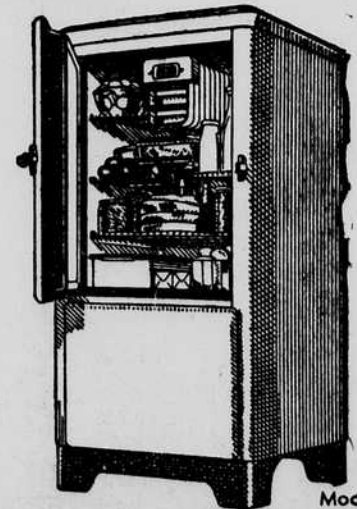
