The league-leading Ahoskie team will play Roanoke Rapids here Saturday afternoon. The game will start at 3:30, a half hour earlier than week-day games.


The slogan is "Beat Ahoskie" which has one of the best semipro teams ever seen on the local diamond and a stirring game is in the offing for Saturday.


