RALLIES HELD IN COUNTY

With the general election next Tuesday, November 3rd, the only time in four years the nation elects a President, local Democrats, under the leadership of County Chairman John W. Martin, are making a final drive to get out every Democratic vote in Roanoke Rapids and Halifax County. The entire Democratic ticket, headed by President Franklin D.
