Driver Is To Be Heard By Mayor

Percy Crawley, driver of the truck which ran over Noland Goodman, 7 year old boy here Saturday, inflicting injuries from which the boy died Sunday, will face manslaughter charges at a hearing before Mayor Jenkins this Friday afternoon.

Crawley is under \$1,000 bond for his appearance. Allsbrook & Benton will represent him at the hearing. Mr. Holloman will appear for the insurance company interested.

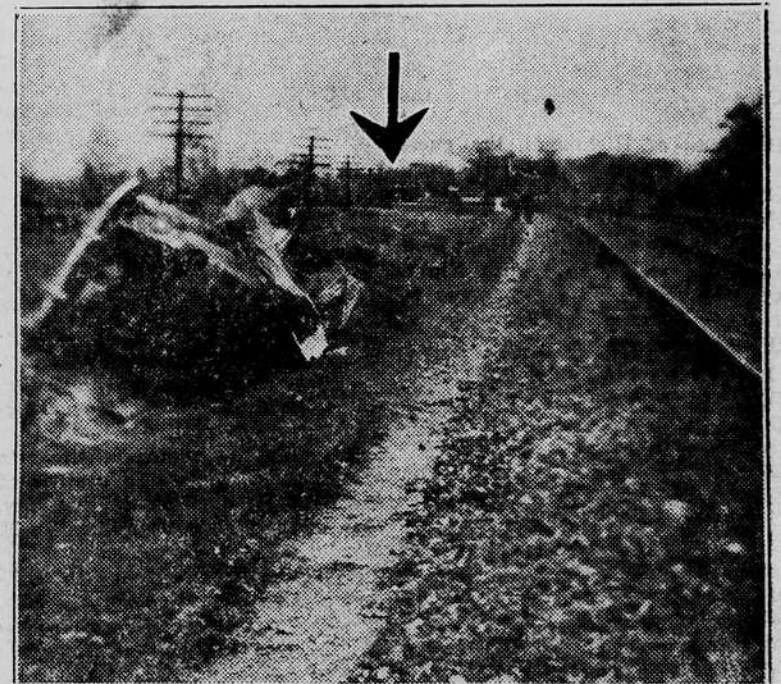
The parents of the dead child had nothing to do with the charge and knew nothing of the action until so informed by Chief Dobbins. The reason is to follow the usual procedure in such cases.

Coroner Cooper did not hold a formal inquest after being informed by the police of the action taken.
