## CAR HITS WAGON ON HIGHWAY

More details were reported tonight on the death of Carl Wright, 7, who died in the Roanoke Rapids Hospital Tuesday morning from injuries when hit by a car Sunday at White Plains, Va.
The car was driven by Miss Helen Harris, a teacher at Ebony, Va. She was accompanied by her moth-
er. Carl was in a wagon, with the tongue; Ida Culp, a small girl, was in the wagon behind him. Her brother, John Culp, was pushing the wagon down the highway. There are two versions of what happened: one, that the boy turned the wagon around into the path of the car, the other that the children were crossing the road and the car was going too fast.
was thrown under the wagon. Car the car and the other two children were thrown to one side and received only bruises. The fatally injured boy was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Prince Wright of White Plains and was one of twins. The remaining twin and another brother, with the parents survive.
