**\$1,117 IS TOTAL
OF RED CROSS ROLL

A total of \$1,117.00 was reported today by Roll Call chairman F. C. Williams, which was \$117 over the thousand dollar quota set for the 1937 Red Cross Roll Call of the Roanoke Rapids Chapter. This year's drive was also one hundred dollars more than the amount of last year's Roll Call.

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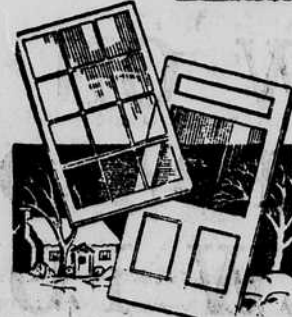
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
