### Together In New Romantic Com'dy At Uptown House

Tyrone Power and Loretta Young are co-starred again in "Second Honeymoon," coming to the Imperial Monday-Tuesday. Already hailed as the merriest "marry-est" romance of the year, the film is said to be their perfect picture together.

The reason is the smart, modern, gay and witty manner that has made them the most exciting sweethearts of the screen. All the world loves a lover, and all the world has followed these two lovers as they show new ways to romance.

When Tyrone and Loretta meet under the Miami moon for an impulsive kiss, their love is news once more, but this time they mean it with all their hearts. Love at first sight is romantic enough, but love at second sight . . . "MMM!" "Second Honeymoon" is their perfect picture together as their "Re-no'd" honeymoon is renewed in the merriest, "marry-est" romance of the year.

The plot concerns the predicament of Meredith who returns from a successful gold trek to Alaska to find that Louise Henry, the girl who promised to wait when he left, has become engaged to another. Ann Sothorn, as a youthful admirer, catches him on the rebound, and is about to lead him to the altar when interference by her family, particularly Mary Boland who plays her scheming mother, inspires the gold seeker to feign amnesia rather than go through with the wedding. Before matters are finally settled to the satisfaction of all concerned, the players are involved in one hilarious situation after another.

A strong supporting company, including Roger Imhof, William Brisbane, Sumner Getchell, and Adrian Morris appear with the three stars.

Drama, romance and comedy, blended into a fast-moving story and highlighted by the picturesque spectacle of life at the U. S. Naval Academy, mark "Annapolis Salute," with James Ellison, Marsha Hunt, Harry Carey and Van Heflin in the leading roles, which comes to the Imperial Saturday only.
