

## Summer-Time Is Salad-Time

**Y**OUR salad can be practically a "meal in itself," yet refreshing, light and nourishing. And, now is the season to give the family or guests salads at practically every luncheon, dinner or supper. Cottage cheese is such a perfect ally to vegetables, fruits, lettuce or greens. Here's a combination your guests will adore!

### LUNCHEON SALAD WITH COTTAGE CHEESE CRISPS

6 tomatoes 1 cup cottage cheese  
Lettuce or other greens Mayonnaisse

Peel tomatoes and cut through the centers in fifths, leaving an uncut portion at the base so that the sections may be spread apart but will remain attached. Place tomatoes on lettuce arranged on a large platter and fill the centers with cottage cheese. Serve with mayonnaisse

or French dressing and Cheese Crisps made as follows:

1 cup flour 6 tablespoons butter  
1/4 teaspoon salt 1/2 cup cottage cheese  
1/2 teaspoon baking powder 1 tablespoon milk  
1 teaspoon celery seed Paprika

Mix and sift the flour, salt and baking powder and stir in the celery seed. Work in the butter with the fingertips or cut in with 2 knives. Combine the cottage cheese and milk and add to the first mixture, stirring in quickly. Turn out on floured board and roll out to 1/8 inch thickness. Cut with a floured knife into strips 1/2 inch wide and 4 inches long. Place on a baking sheet, brush with milk or cream and sprinkle with paprika. Bake in a hot oven (425° F.) for 10 to 12 minutes or until a delicate brown. This recipe will make 35 to 40 crisps.
