## Roanoke Rapids Chapter Passes Quota Set With Final Report Friday Night

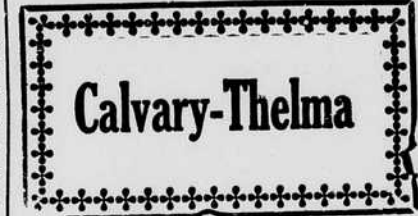
The Roanoke Rapids Chapter of the American Red Cross went over the top and passed its goal, according to returns made tonight to Roll Call Chairman Frank C. Williams, with tomorrow night set for final reports. A total of \$1,280.89 had been reported tonight.

## TO PAINT PICTURES HI SCHOOL STAGE

### Famous Artist And Daughter To Give Program At Local High School Auditorium

For more than a week now Prof. Christian Nielson and his daughter have been engaged in redecorating the stage sets at the high school. Prof. Nielson is a nationally known mural painter and scenic artist. His career as an artist has attracted attention throughout this country and Europe. He is a native of Denmark.

On Thursday and Friday evenings, December first and second, Mr. Nielson, assisted by his daughter, Beverly Nielsen, will give a program of entertainment in the high school auditorium. The music department will assist in this program.

The program will consist of dramatic sketches and interpretive dances by Miss Beverly Nielsen. Miss Nielsen is a graduate student of the Russian ballet dancer Sschernikoff of Washington, D. C. All of her appearances will be in costume. Mr. Nielson will do two complete paintings. The theme of these paintings will be taken from the familiar old songs, "Little Old Church in the Valley" and "The

End of a Perfect Day." Both paintings will be accompanied by the music of these songs and a realistic lighting effect that will lend beauty and realism to the act. The complete picture is actually painted.

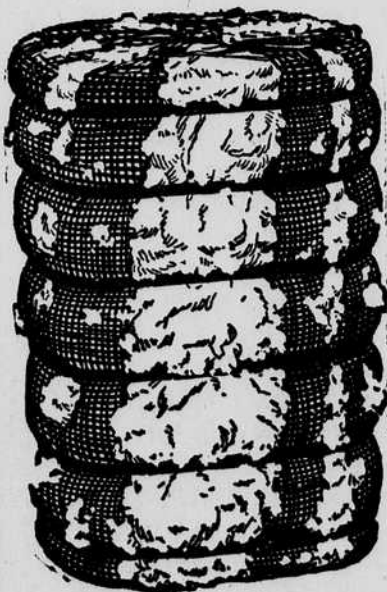
